In working to bridge the gap between education and employment, our focus is on the proficiencies employers say are most needed, which candidates often lack, and can be the most challenging to develop.

Referred to as "employability skills," "soft skills," and "noncognitive skills," we characterize them as **Essential Employability Qualities** (EEQs).






Game Changer: Artificial Intelligence
