


QA Up Close

How QA Evolved


Increased global demand for skilled human labour; rapid growth of HE partnerships, competitive force of the market

Student engagement... investing time in areas relevant to the to support the student experience and institution's reputation (NStEP)


Student partnership... working with students in various parts and stages of the quality process (sparqs)




Africa
