

Legislation

- Australian legislation passed in August 2020 makes it an offence to provide or advertise academic cheating services in higher education
- The legislation is aimed at those who provide cheating services, not at students
- The offences and penalties the legislation creates apply whether the services are provided from within Australia or from overseas
 - Up to two years in jail or AU \$110,00 fine
 - Applications for injunctions to block website access







Detection

- Commercial cheating service providers
 - Database of ~ 3,000 websites offering cheating services
 - But just 600 sites targeting students studying with Australian providers
 - Web traffic analytics for triaging

Enforcement

✤ Over 150 websites blocked, accounting for around 70% of all Aus internet traffic to cheating sites


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- Next round of blocking in April
- Over 770 posts, profiles, pages and channels removed from social media

Education

- Providers, academic staff, students, government
 - Toolkits, workshops, webinars, detection masterclass, advertisements
