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








Definitions

Digital learning is any type of learning that is accompanied by technology or by instructional practice that makes effective use of technology.

Digital Learning encompasses other terms, focusing on:

- Delivery Modalities:
 Online learning (via internet), Hybrid;
 Broadcast TV,
 Classroom-based
- Location: Distance learning (student physically apart from teacher)
- Formats: Synch/Asynch

Online Education

Online education is a subset of digital education. It it mediated by internet technology to span distance between teacher and student and can be delivered in mixed modalities and formats.



Terminology & Definitions

Digital Education

Most general term, involving use of technology in education.

Digital Learning

General term for use of technology in learning, referring to how students learn/are taught.

Distance Education

Category of education where students are at a distance from instructor.

Distance Learning

Learning situations where students are at distance from instructor.

Online Education

Type of digital education, provided via internet, in an online modality.



Definitions: Modalities

In-Person

All instruction takes place in an in-person setting

Online Learning (Modality)

A form of digital learning via internet, defined as "All instruction and interaction is fully online (synchronous or asynchronous.

Hybrid Learning (Modality)

A blend of online and in-person modalities (online instruction is synchronous or asynchronous).

Hyflex Learning (Multi-modality)

Students can move between online and in-person instruction as they see fit.



Definitions: Formats

Asynchronous Learning (Format)

Format in which student-student and student-instructor interaction are separated in time. "Instruction is available for students to access at a time that works best for them."


Synchronous Learning (Format)

Format in which student-student and student-instructor interaction happen in real time. "Instruction takes place in real-time and requires student presence (in-person or virtual) at a set time."

Hybrid Learning (Format)

Format is a blend of synchronous and asynchronous formats.




