Challenges and Opportunities in Internal and External QA

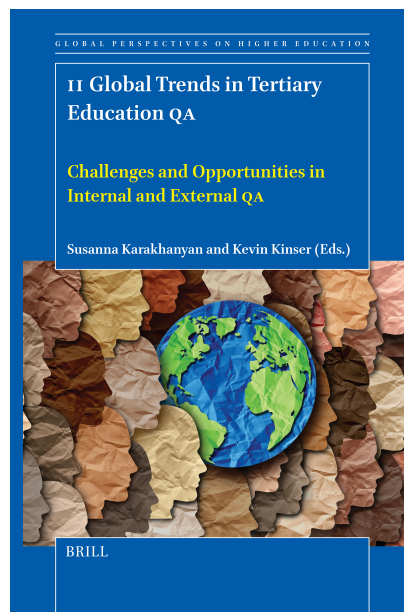
